Trustee Cutler reported that Albany County will allow us to send three candidates to training school tuition free. This should help get us some more potential candidates.

OTHER BUSINESS

- There was a discussion on the DASNY grant and the changes that must be made in the wording of it, such as the money must be used for what it was originally intended. Interim Chief Phil Lindsey would like to eliminate the license plate recorder and replace it with a live scan. This item would be more expensive, and Washington County could help us out with this if needed. Village Mechanic Tom Wolfe mentioned that two of the police vehicles have over 100,000 hours on the engine and will need some potentially expensive repairs. He recommends that the Village should consider leasing vehicles if possible. Mayor Traver mentioned that he is opposed to getting two new vehicles because the cost would be approximately \$120,000.00. Jim Thatcher said that the total of the grant is for vehicle and equipment, and they do not care how or what the money is spent on as long as you do not overspend the allotted money of the grant. A decision will have to be made soon on the future of the police department.
- The Chamber of Commerce is interested in starting a beautification challenge program for homeowners and businesses within the Town and Village. They are requesting a \$1,500.00 matching donation from the Village and Town. Motion by Trustee **Cutler** to approve the \$1,500.00 donation to the Chamber of Commerce pending documentation on how the program will be operated. SECONDED BY Trustee **Carpenter**. ALL AYES. MOTION CARRIED.
- There was a discussion on the Fort Edward Free Library's request for some of the ARPA money. Jim Thatcher reported that the CARES act money is not being distributed anymore and he is not sure what happened, but it is at a standstill now. There is a possibility of researching a joint grant with the library and the Senior Center of Kingsbury & Fort Edward. The Senior Center would have to be the lead agency for the \$300,000.00 grant which would help with improvements to the Center and with the proposed HVAC system for the library.
- Trustee Carpenter reported that Joe Maillle is bringing a brush hog at a cost of \$125.00 per hour to the water plant to help clean up the overgrown grounds. He will be starting on 5/6/2022 and this should dramatically improve the appearance of the grounds. It will also appease the DEC and see if anything else must be done.
- There is an issue with a water break at 154 Fort Edward Road. They do not pay for water, and we do not know where the adjacent lines are and whose responsibilities it is to repair them. The Village will not do any repairs until proper documentation is provided by all the parties involved.
- Village Mechanic Tom Wolfe reported that the 2010 blue/white dump truck is in need of major repairs. The dump box needs to be replaced and rear pinion bearings are shot which makes the truck undriveable. The problem is that there is a major shortage of vehicles, and the price is very expensive, and the time frame could be over a year. He will continue to research all available options.
